## Roberson, Sproles star as Kansas State rolls in opener

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Ell Roberson threw for 205 yards and a career-high three touchdowns and ran for 145 more yards and another score. Darren Sproles ran for a career-high 175 yards and one TD and became Kansas State's career leader in 100-yard games. Coach Bill Snyder's assessment? "Pretty decent." It fell to California coach Jeff Tedford to praise the Wildcats' offensive stars. "They made a lot of big plays,

but the credit goes to their two guys," Tedford said. "I'm not sure they don't do that against anyone." Then again, Snyder had more pressing concerns after the seventh-ranked Wildcats beat California 42-28 Saturday night in the season opener for both teams. Kansas State's defense, historically the team's stronger unit, gave up 440 yards and the first four-touchdown performance by an opponent since a 35-31 loss to Colorado on Oct. 5, 2002.

"They'll be tested in practice on Monday," Snyder said. Sproles' 11th career 100-yard game on 22 carries set a school record, and he extended his own record with his 10th consecutive 100-yard game. The Wildcats' win in the Black Coaches Association Classic was their 14th straight season-opening victory.

Roberson threw TD passes of 5 yards to Travis Wilson and 57 yards to James Terry as the Wildcats took a 27-14 halftime lead. He finished 9-for-18 and carried 18 times. "I felt a little bit rusty at first, but I got more comfortable as the game went along," he said. "The coaches put me in some great positions."

## Cardinals post rare win with pitching

Rolen, Edmonds make great plays behind Tomko, 'pen

ST. LOUIS (AP) — In a matchup of postseason contenders, the little things put the St. Louis Cardinals over the top. Three big defensive plays from third baseman Scott Rolen, aggressive running on a pair of shallow sacrifice flies, a squeeze bunt and resourceful pitching from Brett Tomko led to a 3-0 victory over the Philadelphia Phillies on Sunday.

"That's the way we won games last year," Rolen said. "We were high-powered and scored a lot of runs, but what got us over the hump were games like that." "Games we haven't been winning a lot of this year." The Cardinals, swept in a three-game series at Philadelphia last weekend, took two of three from the Phillies after losing the series opener. They remained tied for first in the NL Central with Houston despite a quiet series from Albert Pujols, who was 0-for-12 after entering the weekend with a 30-game hitting streak. Rolen set the tone against his old team with three hits. He

doubled twice, each time setting up a run, and he singled and scored the final run on So Taguchi's bases-loaded in the eighth. In the field, he ended a bases-loaded threat in the sixth with a sprawling stop to his left of Chance Utley's grounder, recovering in time to produce a force-out. He also snared Pat Burrell's liner to end the fifth and fielded a tough, high hop to retire Marlon Byrd to end the fifth. "Rolen had a monster game," manager Tony La Russa said. "He did everything you can do on the field." The Phillies have lost five of six since their sweep of the Cardinals in Philadelphia, where Rolen was booed every at-bat. "We're getting a lot of guys on base by either walks or hits, we're just not getting the big hits when we need them," Burrell said. "That's been our problem." Tomko (10-8) entered the game leading the NL in hits, runs and home runs allowed, and struggled in his last start, giving up six runs in three innings at Philadelphia. But he's also won three of his last four outings, and allowed five hits in 6 2/3 scoreless innings. He left with the bases loaded in the seventh but Steve Kline escaped by getting Bobby Abreu on a roller to the mound, and Jim Thome on a popup on a full count to shallow left. Thome was hitless in three at-bats, dropping his impressive numbers against the Cardinals this year to 9-for-20 with five homers and 10 RBIs.
